## District Flying Scot Regatta Set for September 23 & 24 at Lake Arthur

Fleet 80 will host the Ohio District Flying Scot Championship Regatta on Lake Arthur on September 23 & 24. We have placed orders for great winds and superb weather so the sailing should be outstanding. If by chance there is a mix-up in our order, a "wind dance" will commence one hour before each race.

We will have both a Championship and a Challenger fleet to offer an appropriate level of competition regardless of ability. Community Sailors and sailors new to racing, here is your chance to compete against others of similar abilities. We will hold three races on Saturday and Lake Arthur's trademark "Bridge-to-Bridge" race Sunday morning.

As an added attraction, Greg Fisher (former North Americans Champion from North Sails) will hold an on-the-water Flying Scot clinic on Friday at 1:30 PM. I know I'm going to be there to latch on to any/all tips to enhance my sailing and put me in "winning" shape for the regatta.

The fleet has rented a house just outside the state park about 1.5 miles from Watts Bay. We will use it as the regatta command post and for a number of social activities such as the dinner on Saturday evening with Uncle Charley's scrumptious ribs and Jim Starr's famous whisky sours a la Joe Shields. At the house we also have limited sleeping and camping available - reserve early. Call Joy 412-731-1640.

The fees for this regatta are not included in your MSC or Community Sail dues. If you would like to sail in this regatta, you will have to register and pay the fee. To help in our planning, please pre-register. We would like to make this a regatta to remember.

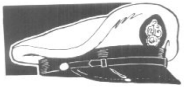

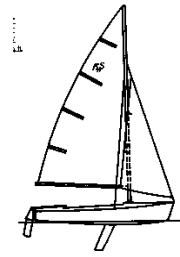

**Addenda to Sailing Instructions for 2000**

The following two items are now part of the Moraine Sailing Club Racing Instructions effective for the summer racing series, 2000:

1. **Good Samaritan Bye.** Any experienced racer may earn a Bye (similar to a Regatta Bye) if he or she decides not to race a particular race or day in order to sail along with a less experienced sailor.
2. **All Challenger Racers must start together.** This means any Flying Scot Challenger must sail in the Challenger Fleet with the other Challenger sailors. This change allows for greater equality between the Challenger fleet. All racers now have an equal opportunity to wind conditions and tactical strategy. If a Scot sailor wants to race with and against other Scots, that person should pay the small additional racing fee to sail in the Championship Series.

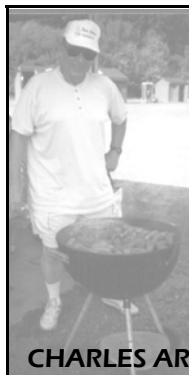
