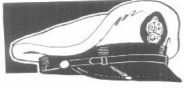

The picture above is the "Freedom", a 1987 Tayana 52. MSC member Allen Murphy crewed on this sailboat last fall for a 700 mile cruise from Oyster Bay, Long Island, NY to Bermuda. It took four days, from Saturday, Nov 2 to Wednesday, Nov 6. Allen writes, "The owner/skipper, Gil Katz, was captain, navigator, and weather forecaster. The three other crew stood 4 hour watches, 4 hours on, 8 hours off. It was a beautiful, wonderful sail! We beat a bad low pressure system by 18 hours, but boats behind us spent up to 8 hours in 45 knot winds and 20 foot seas! We caught a favorable Gulf Stream current, then a meander for over 24 hours of 1 to 1.5 knot current speeding us to Bermuda".

### Another true sailing story

I was reminded of this true story from my (recent) youth: Several years ago, I spent two weeks at Mobjack Sailing Camp in Virginia. We campers tried to learn how to sail by going out on the Chesapeake Bay to sail twice a day under the somewhat inept instruction of the counselors.

Anyone who knows how to sail is sure to know the terms "head up" and "fall off" -- "head up" means to point the boat closer to the direction where the wind is coming from, and "fall off" means to point the boat in the other direction (further away from the source of the wind). If you point the boat too far up in to the wind (i.e., if you "head up" too far), the sail will get back-winded and start to luff (i.e., flap around wildly.)

One day, 4 fellow campers, a counselor and I were out on one of the boats in a stiff breeze. Ann, a camper who had a reputation for being a little bit of an airhead, was at the helm.

Ann wasn't very good at sailing, and at one point she pointed the boat way too far into the wind, causing the sail to start luffing wildly. She had no idea which sheet (rope) to pull or which direction to point the boat to get the sail to fill again, so she started getting frantic. Exasperated, the counselor finally yelled "Fall off! Fall off!"

Ann immediately jumped off the back of the boat.

## MSC Community Sailing Program

The MSC Community Sailing Program (CSP) is designed to provide inexpensive access to club-maintained boats for day sailing and racing at Lake Arthur. For a very reasonable price of \$225 members have access to the CSP Fleet as well as racing privileges and a social membership. By comparison a trailer space at Watts Bay is \$130 and a racing membership is \$100 and you still need to buy a boat and get insurance.

The CSP fleet consists of 4 Flying Scots at Watts Bay and an additional one moored at Davis Hollow so that a trailer hitch is not needed. There is also a Coronado 15 on a trailer at Watts Bay and 13 boats on Racks at Watts Bay including 10 Sunfish, 2 Optimists and one Cape Cod Frosty. ### Day Rentals

Daily Sunfish and Optimist rental is available to all MSC members in good standing. The fee is \$10 per day for Sunfish and \$5 per day for the Optimist. Before a MSC member can take advantage of this program, they must demonstrate their sailing skills and meet the same qualification standards as Community Sailing Program members. Use of the Sunfish and the Optimist by CSP members takes precedence over non-CSP members. Non-CSP members can not reserve boats but must verify that the boats have not been reserved by CSP members. Payment for a rental can be made to any MSC board member.

## Beyond the Water with Cliff and Nora Johnson

*This series of articles focuses on MSC club members. The intent is to help us know one another better, and establish connections beyond the water.*

This is an exclusive. You won't read this anywhere else. Meet Cliff and Nora Johnson, the newest members of the Moraine Sailing Club. So new, that they are probably joining, as I write these words. New to the club, but old friends of mine, so it is an easy story to write. One summer evening in the 80's, at a back porch picnic, I asked everyone there if they liked to sail. I did that a lot then, before I found all the other people who share my love for the lake.

Cliff's eyes lit up, and he said, "I do!" We were skimming across Lake Arthur, in my sunfish, the next day. Cliff and Nora were delighted to find Moraine. "We thought we were landlocked when we moved to Pittsburgh!" Nora said. One sail led to another, and the Johnson's bought my sailboat when I moved on, not to greater things, just another sunfish.

Cliff grew up sailing on the Chesapeake Bay, with his father, and still returns to sail twice a year there with his cousin. Cliff's father had a Norwegian boat, called a Folkboat. "It was a 22 foot all wooden hull. It was the best boat I ever sailed in. He bought a fiber glass later, but it was not the same as wood." Cliff's father was a pastor, and Cliff said "I feel closer to the Lord when I am on the water."

Nora, who is very fair skinned, is not as much of a sailor, but goes along for the day. She can often be found in the shade, sketching or painting. Cliff is a very laid back sailor, and likes to go where the wind takes him. But who knows, he might be caught up in the racing season, and enjoy crewing.

The John sons came to Pittsburgh in the 1970's, when Cliff took a job teaching English at the University of Pittsburgh. They spent five and one half years after that in Germany, where Cliff taught American Studies at the University of Kassel. When they returned to Pittsburgh, Nora took a bachelors degree in Economics, and Cliff went to work for American Express as a

financial advisor. By that time, they had two daughters, who are now married. They have one granddaughter, Devon.

Nora worked in the non-profit sector for many years here, as an organizer at the Thomas Merton Center, then as the director of Rainbow Kitchen. She also worked at East End Cooperative Ministries, Steel Valley Authority, Maglev Incorporated, and most recently with Physicians for Social Responsibility. She likes to read about art, history, and health. Cliff is a Civil War fan, and knows his history well. They are both active in the Sixth Presbyterian Church, in their neighborhood of Squirrel Hill.

So how is it that they are joining the Community Sailing Program? It goes back to that boat they bought from me. It was always heavy, and became heavier, as the boat took on water. The dozen or so sunfish, which the Club owns, look good to them right now. The freedom of it appeals to them. The big question now is how do you dispose of a boat. ### Directions to Northland Library

**From Pittsburgh:** Take I279 North to the McKnight Rd exit. Follow McKnight Rd for 5.5 miles, past Ross Park Mall and Northway Mall. You will come to a light at the intersection of McKnight Rd and Cumberland Rd. Turn left and follow Cumberland past a school. The library is at the top of the hill on the left across from St. John's Lutheran Church.
